

Annex A: Penalties on conviction and proposed application of penalty notices – Fostering services

Section 51 of the Regulation and Inspection of Social Care (Wales) Act 2016 provides that:

A person guilty of an offence under the Act or prescribed within Regulations is liable:

- (a) on summary conviction (in the Magistrate’s Court) to a fine or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding 6 months, or to both
- (b) on conviction on indictment (in the Crown Court) to a fine or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding 2 years, or to both

For offences where a penalty notice system applies, section 54 of the Act restricts the amount of the sum to be payable under a penalty notice to two and a half times level 4 on the standard scale for fines (under the Criminal Justice Act 1982). Level 4 on the standard scale is currently £2,500.
