Working for well-being

When the Welsh Government launched its plan four years ago, there was a shortage of public procurement professionals and a need to develop a more commercially mature workforce. The Covid era exacerbated the situation, bringing unprecedented procurement pressures and a focus on accountability.

Procurement had already been named as a lever for change in Wales' groundbreaking Well-being of Future Generations Act, which will transform the way procurement is planned and delivered. On the horizon, three new procurement bills were also set to bring significant change.

Against this backdrop, the Welsh Government decided that its planned training must extend beyond its own procurement function. It determined to include the wider public sector, to improve the effectiveness of public procurement as a whole and to increase its benefit to the Welsh economy and society.



Pragmatic approach

The Welsh Government had long looked to CIPS for professional procurement training. This time, the need for speed and the immediate application of learning led it to CIPS' Applied Learning Programme (Corporate Award).

CIPS initially tailored the course content to the Welsh public sector, ensuring it was relevant and reflected the region's procurement policies and wider Government strategies. This brought everything to life for students and bolstered the practical value of the programme.

- Raising the profile of what the profession is doing and its potential for regional impact.



Opening opportunities

It has meant that student numbers are high and new professional networks are being developed enthusiastically among past and present students.
