Request for Information – ATISN 10177

I wrote to you on 10 February regarding your request for information. You asked how much money the Welsh Government has spent and how much it intends to spend in future on the following projects along the M4: M4 J28, M4 Corridor around Newport, M4 J41 Port Talbot, M4 Junction 33 Capel Llanilltern and J32 Coryton Interchange.

I can confirm that we hold information relating to your request. £1.2m has been spent on the J28 project and there is a forecast future spend of £18.1m. Up to February 2016, £19.5m has been spent of project level consideration of the M4 Corridor around Newport scheme. Should the proposal progress to detailed design and construction expenditure would be approximately £1bn. The following projects have no forecast future spend: £1.4m has been spent on the J41 project, £8.7m has been spent on the J33 project and £2.3m on the J32 project.

If you are dissatisfied with the Welsh Government's handling of your request, you can ask for an internal review within 40 working days of the date of this response. Requests for an internal review should be addressed to the Welsh Government's Freedom of Information Officer at:
