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This looks fine as a record of the appropriate assessment under the Habitats Regulations. I agree with your conclusion that the works as specified will not have an adverse effect on the integrity of the River Usk SAC, including Otter as a feature of the SAC. (I suggest that the document would be improved by giving the title as "Method Statement including Habitats Regulations Assessment and European Protected Species screening" or similar, to make it clearer what it covers).

There are one or two outstanding issues in relation to Dormouse at the site. I think the discovery of dormouse at the site makes the work proposed even more worthwhile, provided it is done sympathetically under Licence of course.
