ATISN 11146 Information about Glastir contracts 2013-2017

Thank you for your request which I received on 19 January 2017. You asked for information about how many Glastir contracts 2013 to 2017 had additional land included within the final accepted Glastir contracts compared to what was submitted in their original EOI or application form.

From my preliminary assessment I estimate that it will cost more than the appropriate limit set out in the Freedom of Information and Data Protection (Appropriate Limit and Fees) Regulations 2004 to answer your request. The appropriate limit specified for central government is £600. This represents the estimated cost of it taking over 24 hours of time to determine whether we hold the information and to thereafter locate, retrieve and extract it.

In order to provide you with the information requested it would require approximately 5 days work involving:

- Analysis – 2 days,
- Development – 2 days,
- Testing – 1 day.

This is based on using ICT to extract the data.

By way of contrast, if this work was done manually it would require 2 hours work per contract for 2,406 live Glastir Advanced contracts which equals 4,812 hours or 664 days work.

Consequently, I have decided not to provide you with the information you have requested.

You may wish to refine your request by narrowing its scope by being more specific about what information you particularly wish to obtain, including any dates or period



of time relevant to the information required. If you do refine your request in this way, this will be treated as a new request.

If you are dissatisfied with the Welsh Government's handling of your request, you can ask for an internal review within 40 working days of the date of this response. Requests for an internal review should be addressed to the Welsh Government's Freedom of Information Officer at:
