A Welsh Government spokesman said: "We are aware of reports of unauthorised works being undertaken on common land near the Hendy Wind Farm site.

"However, it is a matter for the Local Planning Authority to investigate any alleged unauthorised works."

**Notes to editors**

We cannot discuss any aspect of the Hendy Wind Farm planning decision and the High Court challenge period for the decision ends on 6 December 2018.

The matter was raised by Andrew RT Davies during a debate in Plenary on Tuesday (20 November). Cabinet Secretary Lesley Griffiths said, which is in the record of proceedings and can be used, in response: "Members should be aware that Welsh Government can't reconsider the decisions. I can pass no further comment. We've provided consistent support to communities as a vital part of energy development in Wales and anyone who wishes to question the decision on Hendy windfarm and the reasoning behind it, and the decision letter is there for people to see, can do it through the court."
