Request for Information – ATISN 12876

I wrote to you on 14 January regarding your request for information. You have requested the following information in relation to Ffynnon Lane which is situated on the A40, immediately west of Llanddewi Velfrey and serves the area of Ffynnon:

1. *Did this lane form part of the A40 trunk road prior to the roads current layout and were SWTRA the responsible agency?*
2. *All documentation / information in whatever available form that supports SWTRA view that when the A40 route was altered to its current route Ffynnon Lane became the responsibility of another agency.*
3. *When the current route was completed what other lanes were altered / affected and whose responsibility did these areas become?*
4. *Why, if SWTRA do not accept responsibility for Ffynnon Lane does Land Registry show that it is and why has SWTRA never sought to alter this?*

I can confirm that we hold the information you have requested.

1. The lane did originally form part of the “old” trunk road alignment, however it was de-trunked by way of the London to Fishguard Trunk Road (Ffynnon Bridge, Near Commercial) Order 1969.
2. Please find enclosed the 2 Orders(line order and Side Roads Order(SRO)) in relation to responsibility of the route mentioned.
3. Only a short section of the (new highway) connecting road is currently titled to Welsh Government, this is because we used our Compulsory Purchase Order

powers to acquire the land used for the “new” connecting road. That said the SRO supersedes this and places the responsibility for this road with Pembrokeshire CC.

4. The “old” trunk road remains unregistered. The “old” trunk road would form part of Pembrokeshire CC Local Highway Network.
