For this scale, respondents were shown a series of 6 statements and asked to indicate, the extent to which each statement applied to the way they felt. There were 3 statements about 'emotional loneliness (EL)' and 3 about 'social loneliness (SL)'. 1. I experience a general sense of emptiness (EL) 2. I miss having people around me (EL) 3. I often feel rejected (EL) 4. There are plenty of people I can rely on when I have problems (SL) 5. There are many people I can trust completely (SL) 6. There are enough people I feel close to (SL) The scale uses three response categories: Yes / More or less / No - where the neutral and positive answers are scored as "1" on the negatively worded questions (in this instance, questions 1-3). On the positively worded items (questions 4-6), the neutral and negative answers are scored as "1". This means that an answer of 'more or less' is given the same score as 'yes' or 'no', depending on the question. The scores for each individual question are added together to provide an overall loneliness measure. This gives a possible range of scores from 0 to 6, where 0 is least lonely and 6 is most lonely. For reporting purposes in this bulletin we have considered people who have a score of 4 to 6 as being lonely. Non-pensioner adults were asked whether they had things like 'a holiday away from home for at least a week a year', 'enough money to keep their home in a decent state of decoration', or could 'make regular savings of £10 a month or more'. The questions for adults focussed on whether they could afford these items. These items are really for their 'household' as opposed to them personally which is why they were previously called 'household material deprivation'. Pensioners were asked slightly different questions such as whether their 'home was kept adequately warm', whether they had 'access to a car or taxi, when needed' or whether they had their hair done or cut regularly'.
