OPENCAST COAL ACT 1958

**THE SMITHS COLLIERY
(SUSPENSION OF PUBLIC
RIGHTS OF WAY) ORDER 1979
(REVOCATION) ORDER 2006**

Made 21 November 2006

Coming into force 1 December 2006

WHEREAS authorised operations have been carried out in pursuance of the authorisation granted under section 1(1) of the Opencast Coal Act 1958⁽¹⁾ (hereinafter referred to as “the Act”) on 10 September 1979 and referred to in The Smiths Colliery (Suspension of Public Rights of Way) Order 1979 (hereinafter referred to as “the Suspension Order”) made on that date

AND WHEREAS the National Assembly for Wales (hereinafter referred to as “the National Assembly”) is satisfied that it is no longer necessary for the purpose of carrying on the authorised operations for the rights of way to continue to be suspended by the Suspension Order

AND WHEREAS the rights of way cited in the Suspension Order, other than those extinguished in whole or in part by The Borough of Llanelli (Lamberts and Smiths Collieries Opencast Sites, Carway – Proposed Golf Course) Public Footpath (Various) Stopping-up Order 1986⁽²⁾ and The Carmarthenshire County Council (Footpaths at Carway) Public Path Diversion Order 2000⁽³⁾, have been restored
