Following a petition launched by two Welsh school students, a committee of Welsh Assembly Members has agreed to ask the Welsh Government to consider whether the collective worship requirement placed on schools breaches human rights law.

Currently all schools in Wales must hold 'broadly Christian' daily worship. This referral of the issue to Welsh Government by the petitions committee is a great step towards removing this archaic and discriminatory requirement.

As you may be aware, there have been high-profile cases where the church has sought to take over local community schools, against a background where over 50% of people within Wales say they have no religion.

As a Rossett resident, a mother of a four year old child just entering the education system and as a Humanist, I respectfully ask you to back this change and support the need for freedom from religion or belief in settings where daily worship has no place.
