### **Request for Information – ATISN 13545**

Thank you for your request for information dated 30 October. You asked -

1. How much money the Welsh Government has paid to Carillion since the start of 2018
2. Including details of each payment made
3. How much money the Welsh Government expects to pay Carillion's administrators for other services in the future and, if possible, when
4. What these payments would pay for
5. How much money has been spent on legal advice regarding payments to Carillion since January 2018

I can confirm that we hold the following information relating to your request –

**A40 Llanddewi Advice – in relation to the replacement contract with Arup, Purchase Order(PO) raised 28.09.2018** - Blake Morgan, £990.00 (excluding VAT). The above was for reviewing the draft Scope provided by the Employer's Agent to ensure it covers everything it should in relation to the new contract with Arup and draft a bespoke form of agreement clearly outlining the background to this contract (e.g. Carillion's demise, Arup part of their supply chain, WG engaging Arup on the back of the collateral warranties etc.) and Final review of the contract documents prior to signature.

There was a further PO raised 21.12.2018 for A40 Legal Advice, value £858.00 excluding VAT.

### **Contracts Advice – Carillion (x2)**

Blake Morgan, £2,500.00 (excluding VAT). There are two payments -  
*29<sup>th</sup> January 2018*: to advise on options available under procurement law, for resolving the issues caused by the insolvency of Carillion, in respect of A40 and A55 projects respectively.

*7<sup>th</sup> March 2018*: in relation to when Blake Morgan had to draft notices of termination for the A40 Llanddewi and A55 J15/16 project as well as drafting deed of assignments.



### **A465 Section 3 Sub-contractor Advice –**

Blake Morgan provided advice for each of the sub-contractor agreements to replace Carillion on Section 3. Blake Morgan reviewed separately the contracts for each sub-contract:

Arup – £650.00 (advice on whether WG could use the sub-contractor warranty to instruct Arup). PO raised 12.02.2019

GT Jones – £1,000. PO raised 14.12.2018

TACP (UK) Limited - £1,000. PO raised 19.12.2018
