ATISN 14081 – ‘Five Mile’ Restriction

Thank you for your request to the Welsh Government for information under the Freedom of Information Act (2000) received on 24 June. I have interpreted your request as follows:

- *To provide a copy of the scientific paperwork that supports a 5 mile travel restriction on the people of Wales*

The decision to move from ‘stay home’ to ‘stay local’ and to indicate the distance for local as around five miles was a policy conclusion which took account of the various strands of evidence, such as the benefits of limiting the numbers of interactions between people and communities.

The rationale is captured in the First Minister’s written statement and associated guidance below:

The request you sent me contains personal information about you - for example, your name and address. - to require us to rectify inaccuracies in that data
- to (in certain circumstances) object to or restrict processing
- for (in certain circumstances) your data to be 'erased'
- to (in certain circumstances) data portability
- to lodge a complaint with the Information Commissioner's Office (ICO) who is our independent regulator for data protection
