I can confirm that we do not hold the information that you describe. The principal objective of the audit is to compile such a list.

- 4. A full breakdown of the estimated cost for the audit.**

The cost of carrying out the audit is covered by refocussing internal Welsh Government staffing resources; together with some specialist input at a cost of up to £7,000.
