Thank you for your request which I received on 28 August. You asked for information relating to:

- levels of certain metals within the soil of the Roath area of Cardiff; and
- levels of people being diagnosed with multiple sclerosis in the Cardiff area, compared to the rest of the UK.

Following a search of our paper and electronic records, I have established the information you require is not held by the Welsh Government.

I suggest in relation to metal levels within soils you approach Cardiff City Council's contaminated land team (part of Shared Regulatory Services), who may hold this information. Further contact information can be found here:
