ATISN 14938 – Abortion Pills

Thank you for your request to the Welsh Government for information under the Freedom of Information Act (2000) received on 24 February. I have interpreted your requested information regarding abortion pills as follows:

A complete list of names of the women's groups, clinicians and other stakeholders that were initially consulted for the temporary approval of abortion pills for the use at home during the Covid19 pandemic.

Our Response

Before advising on the temporary approval of abortion pills, Welsh Government initially consulted with the following stakeholders:

British Pregnancy Advisory Service

Welsh Government also met with members of the [Cross Party Group on Women's Health](#) who have a role in highlighting women's health issues including abortion and do so through partnership and collaboration with NHS providers and Voluntary organisations advocating on issues linked to women's health.
