

To whom it may concern,  
I was surprised about a wind farm being built in Leckwith. As a resident of Llandough for over 30 years I don't feel I have received enough information about this proposal.

I also must raise an objection to the possible proposal that the lorries needed for transporting the goods necessary for this build are suggesting travelling through the village of Llandough. This is not an acceptable decision. We are a small village with a Hospital and a school within its centre.

Having heavy goods lorries travelling through the village is ridiculous.

At the moment when people have parked cars outside their houses, as they are correctly allowed to do, if a bus tries to pass them, and a car is coming from the opposite direction, then either the bus or the car has to pull over to one side to allow the other to pass as there is insufficient room for them to pass each other safely. When this happens at peak times, it does cause a problem and also a traffic jam. These roads were not built for heavy goods vehicles.

Half way down the hill there is a Pedestrian Crossing. This is to allow residents to cross the road safely.

Children use this crossing regularly when coming home from school. With heavy lorries using this road then I do not see how you can guarantee the safety of people using this crossing, as we have enough of a problem stopping people speeding through the village at present. I would also like to know who will be carrying out, and paying, for the repairs to the road caused by the weight of these vehicles. We have problems enough, having

potholes in the road repaired, and this would seem yet another problem that would be left for us to deal with. I object to the suggested use of these Heavy Goods Vehicles travelling through the village.
