4–5 Foreword from a Royal family member, advisor, or correspondent.

Chapter 1 – Coronation and commonwealth (single page chapter opener)

8–9 – Great Granny Isla explains the 70th Jubilee to her great grandchild Isabella and the story begins.

10–11 – Isabella sees Great Granny’s Treasures Box for the first time.

12–13 – Isabella finds a picture of the Queen inside and learns about the Coronation.

14–15 – Reference spread – Coronation shown like a scrapbook page full of pictures of the Queen, with information about the coronation and supporting memorabilia.

16–19 – Reference spreads – Map of the UK in the centre, then four coloured timelines coming from each coloured country – England, Wales, Scotland and Northern Ireland. Each timeline to detail the individual history of the countries of the UK. Page 19 – Kings and Queens of Scotland, Wales, and Northern Ireland

20–21 – Reference spread – Cultures of the UK – a celebration of all things English / Scottish / Welsh / Northern Irish to highlight individual identities in terms of landmarks, sports, history and culture, and the arts.

22–23 – Isabella discovers the world map and learns about the Commonwealth.

24–25 – Reference spread – Commonwealth countries explored, including a map of the world showing the Commonwealth countries with a colour key for current countries of the Commonwealth and former countries of the Commonwealth. As well as reference box on Commonwealth campaigners – Waangari Maathai, Nelson Mandela, and Malala Yousafzai.

Page 26 – Glossary (single page) for the chapter.

Chapter 2 – Family and friends (single page chapter opener)

28–29 – Isabella finds her own family tree in the Treasures Box before learning about the Royal family tree from her Great Granny.

30–31 – Reference spread showing the Royal family tree of the House of Windsor, going from King George V in 1910 to the present-day Queen Elizabeth II.

32–33 – Isabella finds out the meaning and the history of the British monarchy, including the first monarch of England, the system of monarchy, and the Queen’s parliamentary duties.

34–35 – Great Granny parallels the love of her life with the Queen and Prince Philip.

36–37 – Isabella’s friends come over to see the Treasures Box to find memorabilia to take in to school for Show and Share.

38–39 – The family do a sightseeing bus tour of London, visiting places related to the Queen, including a mini, simplified map of London showing the locations of Buckingham Palace, Westminster Abbey, Big Ben, Houses of Parliament, London Eye.

Chapter 3 – Ambitions and achievements (single page chapter opener)

42–43 – Great Granny and the Queen’s shared love of animals, **and the Queen’s passion for corgis and horse racing in particular.**

44–45 – Great Granny explains how the Queen stepped up to the throne as a young woman following the unexpected death of her father.

46–47 – Great Granny describes life in wartime and how the Queen helped the war effort, including a reference box on The Blitz, a reference box on the Queen’s wartime service, and an explanation of ration books.

48–49 – Great Granny supporting the Crown Act of 2013 to encourage gender equality, including information about the Suffragettes fighting for the right to vote and a reference box about the Crown Act.

50–51 – Reference spread – Timeline of modern history – the last century, incorporating all the royal and historic events touched on in the book, starting with the birth of the Queen in 1926 and continuing to the present day.

52–53 – Great Granny and Isabella celebrate the Queen as the longest reigning monarch.

Page 54 – Glossary (single page) for the chapter.

Chapter 4 – Charity and care (single page chapter opener)

56–57 – Great Granny explains the incredible charity work of the Queen, including how she is one of the world’s biggest charity supporters and supports more than 500 British charities.

58–59 – Reference spread – to detail the various charity work carried out by the Queen and the other members of the Royal family, including personal donations, Remembrance Sunday, Prince’s Trust, the Royal Foundation, and future patrons.

60–61 – Great-Granny introduces the main British charities supported by the Royal Family, including BookTrust, Barnados, Friends of the Elderly, and Save the Children, with supporting information about them.

62–63 – Great Granny talks about the Queen’s visits to Commonwealth countries, the extent of her travels, and her love of meeting people from different nations, as well as an information box on Brexit and the UK leaving the European Union.

64–65 – Isabella introduces the Royal website to Great Granny’s delight, including the Queen’s

historic emails.

66–67 – Great Granny recalls the Queen and James Bond’s arrival at the 2012 London Olympics, plus an information box about the success of UK athletes at the London Olympics and Paralympics.

Chapter 5 – Inspiration and innovation (single page chapter opener)

70–71 – Great Granny explains how her childhood was different from the modern world and how household inventions evolved during her and the Queen’s lives.

72–73 – Reference spread – A century of invention, highlighting the major inventions and breakthroughs of the last century.

74–75 – Great Granny details major advances and events in the wider world, including the 1969 Moon landing, England winning the 1966 World Cup, construction of the Channel Tunnel, Amy Johnson flying solo from the UK to Australia, and the invention of the World Wide Web.

76–77 – Great Granny explains how the Queen works alongside changing governments, with an information panel introducing and summarising the 14 Prime Ministers during the Queen’s reign.

78–79 – Great Granny and Isabella discuss extraordinary people recognised by the Queen, explanation of knighthoods, damehoods and other special honours, with mini biographies of knights and dames across a range of genres.
