Thank you for your request to the Welsh Government for information under the Freedom of Information Act (2000) received on 21November 2022. You have requested the following:

- 1. What discussions has the Welsh Government had with the Scottish Government on charging patients for treatment?
- 2. Has the Welsh Government had any discussions on charging patients for treatment in the last 3 years?

Our Response

- Discussions have not taken place with the Scottish Government regarding charging patients for treatment. However, Welsh Government do speak to other UK nations with regards to existing charging rates.
- 2. There have been no discussions within Welsh Government regarding charging patients for treatment within the last 3 years.
