- 6. Please disclose how the newly published Flooding planning framework has been or will be applied by WG in this estate/service change by C & V Health Board?

Our Response

Welsh Government can confirm that it holds a copy of the completed Programme Business Case (PBC) and this is attached. The PBC answers requests 1-3. On requests 4-6, the PBC is a document setting out the Programme Vision and High-Level Objectives. If the PBC is formally endorsed by Welsh Government Ministers, Cardiff & Vale University Health Board will progress through the iterative Business Case process and deliver subsequent Business Cases (Strategic Outline, Outline Business Case and Full Business Case). The Welsh Government will use HM Treasury Guidance and other planning and environmental policies to assess these Business Cases as they progress through the necessary formal scrutiny.
