Information requested

Thank you for your request which I received on 11 September 2023. You asked for:

- 1. Information on how it is calculated that the 20mph speed limit will save the NHS £92m.
- 2. How many patients will not require NHS attention.
- 3. How and how much money is calculated per patient against the £92m quoted.
- 4. How it is calculated a budget of £32.5m for the implementation of the policy and why on a recent television programme you stated it was £30m.
