Thank you for your requests for information which I received on 7 September.

Your request

You have asked for the following information:

- 1. How much are emissions increased during traffic congestion on the M4 around Newport?
- 2. I have seen figures quoting a figure of a 20% increase in emissions due to vehicles being less efficient at 20mph plus increased journey times?

Our Response

I can confirm that the Welsh Government holds the information you have requested for question one, however, question two is not a request for information. You may wish to refine this part of your request.

For question one, the Welsh Government and its Ministers are responsible for trunk roads and motorways and have a statutory duty, under the Air Quality Standards (Wales) Regulations 2010, to ensure compliance with limits for nitrogen dioxide (NO₂) in ambient air. Statutory limits have been set for levels of nitrogen dioxide in ambient air for the protection of human health.

Locations on the strategic road network in Wales where there may be poor air quality are principally identified via the national DEFRA Pollution Climate Mapping (PCM) Model, which is the agreed national source for identifying areas or routes that exceed the legal limit levels set for pollutants. DEFRA's ambient air quality mapping tool which is derived from the PCM model, can be viewed online at UK Ambient Air Quality Interactive Map.

A reduced 50mph speed limit on the M4 at Newport has been in place since June 2018 to support achieving compliance with NO2 limit values. Air quality data and analysis can be found in the following locations on our website:-
