Thank you for your request for information dated 9 September.

Information requested

- 1. Since the law changed in relation to the Welsh national speed limit in urban areas to 20mph what is the total spend on this project?
- 2. Legal and administrative costs.
- 3. Costs of new signs.
- 4. Costs to Welsh Government and Local Authorities for installation of new signs.
- 5. Money spent on contractors and sub contractors to install new signs.
- 6. The absolute spend in real terms from the inception to completion of this project.

Our response

1. To date the figure is £36,728,709 broken down as follows:

Grants – Cap & Rev (awarded not paid)

21/22 - £ 1,987,857 22/23 - £ 8,179,585 23/24 - £23,917,350 **Total** £34,084,792

Purchase Orders – Cap & Rev (raised not paid)

21/22 - £ 554,333.79 22/23 - £1,432,589.82 23/24 - £ 656,993.79 **Total £2,643,917.40**
