Community Detoxification Support and access to Medical Prescribing: This includes prescribing for detoxification from alcohol and relapse prevention prescribing. This service provides:

- Advice, guidance and information on detoxification
- Presentations to preparation groups on community detoxification
- Screening for suitability for home detoxification
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- Liaison with primary care prescribers
- Home visits for those undertaking the detoxification
- Preparation and aftercare plans for clients
- Advice and guidance for carers

The following services will be provided for Drug and Alcohol Clients:

Preventative Medical Services:

- The direct provision of screening and testing for BBVs such as hepatitis B, hepatitis C and HIV
- Inoculation for Hepatitis B
