#### Progress in the period covered by the report including key stages/milestones achieved Network development and maintenance programme:

- Further Signage audits have been undertaken on sections of Lon Las Cymru and signs manufactured for Merthyr section.
- The completed Network Development Plan (NDP) updated to include latest ATF scheme completions. Plans for publishing data ongoing. The Paths for Everyone team continues to develop the NDP as a planning tool for future network improvements and new routes, which has included feeding into the approved ATF schemes for 24/25.
- Lon Las Ogwen scheme is progressing on site and grant contribution has been claimed by Gwynedd CC.
- Legal agreements for the Morfa Bacus scheme completed and grant claimed. Plan submitted for 24/25 delivery.
- Inception meeting held for Wayfinding Pilot feasibility in Merthyr. Abergavenny also progressing with funding from LA.

### Workplaces healthy travel support:

- Continued support for HTC organisations in Swansea and Gwent and to a lesser degree (due to the completion of level 1 of the charter) Cardiff and the Vale.
- Face to face catch up with Dr Tom Porter and Cardiff organisations at Pedal Power in Q4.
- 35 free bike loans have gone out to staff from HTC signatory organisations in Swansea of which 12 have been loaned out in quarter 3. 16 in Gwent of which 5 were loaned out during quarter 3: there are currently 14 people on the waiting list for bike loans across both areas.
- Planned led ride with SCVS in Swansea for June 2024.
- Individual support sessions organised for signatories to help improve their HTC scoresheets.

- Case study completed highlighting how the bike loan scheme allowed an occupational therapist to carry out their visits by e-bike. The trial has persuaded the said employee to now go on and purchase their own e-bike through the cycle to work scheme. Attendance and contribution to Swansea Bay cross organisational meetings. Also taking an active role in the scoring process with the chairperson of the Swansea HTC as well as helping to organise a face to face meeting with all organisational leads in February.
- Promotion of travel schemes to all organisations.
- The creation of a bike maintenance map for the Swansea Bay area as well as South Wales.
- Second e-cargo loan to Taff housing to further investigate the option of staff using ecargos with the second bike being used by housing maintenance staff to carry out small repairs to social housing stock.
- Attended Greener Abergavenny event with Sustrans stall to highlight the importance of healthy sustainable travel. Information to be shared with all HTC organisations to highlight healthy travel options within Monmouthshire and wider Wales region.
- Sustainable travel event at Bedwas community centre. Sustrans information stand promoting healthy active travel and highlighting access to HTC bike libraries in Caerphilly and surrounding counties.
- All Gwent HTC organisations online meeting took place to review progress to understand what can be done to ensure each organisation meets level one of the charter.
- Planned event with Gwent HTC organisations to progress level one of the HTC Charter in Gwent and to explore opportunities around signatories signing up to level 2 of the charter.
- Engage directly with organisations of Gwent HTC that have shown an interest in Level 2 of the charter.
- Preliminary meetings with Aberystwyth university and Hywel Dda health board over Sustrans participation in West/Mid Wales future HTC
- Delivery of a presentation to potential signatories of West/Mid Wales HTC outlining current work Sustrans carries out with existing charters.
- Continued exploration of future opportunities with private sector organisations around the Business HTC.
- E-Cargo bike loan to Cardiff University for use by estates staff to explore the option of switching from vans to Cargo bikes thus contributing to the Universities policy of Carbon reduction around central Cardiff campuses and student residential accommodation.
- Introduction of XYZ 3-wheel Cargo bike into HTC bike library fleet with this bike going on loan to Cardiff University estates department for transportation of goods around Park Place Campus utilising existing cycle infrastructure in the area as a demonstrator to replace motor vehicular use on short journeys.
- Proposed joint loan with e-move for a beneficiary of Swansea Bay UHB physiotherapy unit.
- Continued support for Gwent HTC with support geared to helping organisations that are yet to achieve level one certification of the charter.
- Providing support for launch of HTC signatory organisation workplace active travel scheme.
- Attendance at event highlighting the benefits of cycle to work scheme for employees.
- Attendance at event, demonstrating the use of E-Bikes and E-Cargo bikes to support staff to reduce reliance on car/vans for short journeys around Newport.
- Continued support to access Gwent bike library for signatory organisation staff with a further loans in quarter 4.
- Planned support for Aneurin Bevan health board to explore options on signing up for level 2 of the HTC
- Attendance at cross organisational monthly meetings to discuss progress and share best practice between organisations within the Gwent area.

- Attendance of cross organisational meetings for all signatories, including the recent 'in person' meeting which Sustrans helped to deliver and advise on, ensuring all signatories have consistency in their approach to scoring.
