## ATISN 20808 - Save a Life Cymru

Thank you for your request to the Welsh Government for information under the Freedom of Information Act (2000) received on 30 July 2024. You referred to a previous response dated 6 December 2022 and requested the following:

- 1 Can you please confirm how much funding has been given to date to Save a Life Cymru with regards to public access defibrillators (AEDs)?
- 2 Can you confirm how many AEDs have been purchased under this funding?
- 3 Can you confirm where SALC purchases their AEDs and how much they pay per item?
- 4 Of those purchased, how many have now been allocated and now publicly available in Welsh communities?
- 5 How much of the funding SALC receives is paid on staff and a breakdown of salaries?

## **Our Response**

Please see below the information we have on funding allocated to Save a Life Cymru and the breakdown of its staff resource. However, it is important to note that not all this resource is specifically for public access to defibrillators. An additional £1 million was provided to the Welsh Ambulance Services University NHS Trust in 2021-22 for defibrillator equipment, which were allocated in collaboration with Save a Life Cymru.
