

## Play Sufficiency Assessment Toolkit – Tool 11

This tool provides a list of questions which may be used to gather information and views of parents on play opportunities. Local authorities may wish to add questions to ascertain the child's age and other information useful as part of the Play Sufficiency Assessment. Consideration should be given to the design of the survey so that parents can provide information for more than one child.

## Surveying parents

Using questions from the Play Satisfaction survey may provide further evidence about how parents and caregivers view play. These might be asked via a webbased survey, in small meetings with parents, or as short polls on social media.
