Please provide the total cost of the roll-out of these reading lists including:

- a. The initial cost to deliver
- b. The annual cost to keep the books fresh (i.e. to replace used or missing books or cover new additions)

Our Response

The Welsh Government has contributed to the Reading Well scheme. This funding has supported books on specific topics each year and marketing and promotional activities. Public libraries may procure additional sets of the titles, and are responsible for the maintenance as part of their collection development activities:

Year	Topic	Funding (£)
2018/19	Dementia	349,999.98
2019/20	Mental Health	349,712.98
2020/21	Children	366,000
2021/22	Teen (Young People)	366,928.00

In the year 2023/24, £380,000 was granted to update the dementia booklist.
